LITTLE STEPS

Learning new technology can be a challenge. It's not about learning everything at once; it's about learning one skill that you can use easily and then adding others along the way. There are many ways to begin simple integration steps. Integrating a video clip into a lesson provides a starting point. Simply creating a basic web page and keeping it up to date is a great accomplishment. Master that and you'll better understand how to create a moodle page that provides interactivity for your students.
