## INDIANA DOE TO LAUNCH "LEARNING CONNECTION"

If you have ever wondered what its like to freely collaborate with teachers from across the state on lessons, directly align lessons to state standards, or have access to all of the state data on any of your students in one place, you will soon have to wonder no more. The Indiana Department of Education is in the process of launching a new website called the "Learning Connection." The website will allow teachers, administrators, and school districts to sign up for accounts to do all of these things. The reporting capabilities alone would be enough to enthuse most educators. One of the main goals of the site is to centralize data on student achievement bringing together data from ISTEP, mClass, Acuity and others. This means you will be able to compare all of the test data on your students from one single spot. Another goal of the site is to allow teachers, bound to their local areas, to create a learning community with other teachers from around the state. The site will allow collaborative workspaces that allow you to invite others to join you in chat and collaboratively create lessons. Many other interesting features are also being integrated into the site. The DOE is shooting for initial release by the end of the month. I'll keep you apprised of how its going and direct you to the proper address when the site goes live so you can take a peek.
